<b>Healthy Families America</b>	Parents facing challenges (e.g. single parent, low-income, substance abuse problems, victim of abuse or domestic violence). Children 0-5.	Begin prenatally, support parent-child interaction and child development, link to a medical provider.	Biweekly visits prenatally, weekly visits 6 -9 months post- partum, to biweekly then monthly as child ages	Promote positive parenting, to enhance child health and development, and to prevent child abuse and neglect.	YES	YES
<b>Parents As Teachers</b>	Expectant parents and families with children up to age 5	Home visits beginning prenatally through age 3 (Born to Learn curriculum) or up to to age 5 with additional curriculum; parent group meetings, developmental screening, resource network	Home visits at least monthly, can be more frequent if indicated	Increase parent knowledge of early childhood development and improve parenting practices; provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues; prevent child abuse and neglect; increase school readiness and school success	YES	YES
<b>Nurse Family Partnership</b>	Low-income, first time moms	Home visits by public health nurses begin prenatally to age 2. Interventions are designed to facilitate change in families' attitude, knowledge and skills.	Home visit schedule follows developmental stages of pregnancy and early childhood (approx. 6-9 visits during pregnancy and 20 from birth to second birthday	Improved pregnancy outcomes; child health and development; maternal self-sufficiency and life course development	YES	YES
<b>HIPPY USA</b>	Low-income and low education. Entry: 3-4 years. Exit: 5 years.	Parenting classes and books given to parents with activities to do with children; home visits	Parents meet with paraprofessionals biweekly for 45-60 minutes	Help parents with limited education prepare their children for school entry	NO	YES
<b>Parent-Child Home Program</b>	Parental low-level of education, low-income, language and literacy barriers. Entry: 2-3 years old. Exit: 4-5- years old.	Home visits include verbal interaction and reading and play activities. Home visitors are trained in multicultural awareness.	Visits for half-an-hour, twice-a-week. A program year consists of a minimum of 46 home visits	To prepare children to enter school ready to learn	NO	YES
<b>Project SafeCare</b>	Families at risk for abuse or neglect. Children from birth-12 years.	Home visits providing 3 module curriculum focus on 3 modules: Parent-Child Interactions, Health Care, and Safety	Visits for 1-2 hours each, once per week. Lasts 18-20 weeks.	Prevention of child abuse and neglect.	NO	NO?(4-6 months)
